

GENERAL ORDINANCE NO. 13, 2016
AS AMENDED

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 5 OF THE *TERRE HAUTE CITY CODE*.

WHEREAS, the Common Council seeks to reserve the free use and enjoyment of public spaces.

IT IS HEREBY ORDAINED by the Common Council of the City of Terre Haute as follows:

SECTION 1. *Terre Haute City Code* Chapter 5, is hereby amended with the addition of the underlined text:

...

Sec. 5-70 Disorderly Conduct in Parks.

No person shall purposely annoy another, or speak or shout in a loud tone, or utter any profane, threatening, abusive or indecent language, or be guilty of any immoral or indecent conduct or action, or canvass for or solicit any subscription or purchase, or play any game of chance, ~~or sleep on any park bench or in any park shelter~~, or be under the influence of any intoxicating liquor in any public park, public parkway or public boulevard of the City.

...

Sec. 5-71 Public Meetings, Speeches Prohibited Without Permission.

No person shall publicly hold any meeting or preach, pray or make any speech of any sort in any public park, public parkway or public boulevard of the City or play any music therein, except upon written permission of the Board of Park Commissioners or Park Superintendent.

...

Sec. 5-76 Trespassing Prohibited.


No person, unless authorized to do so by the Board of Park Commissioners or Park Superintendent, shall enter any building or enclosure in any public park, public parkway or public boulevard of the City on which a notice of "no admittance" or similar sign is posted.


Section 2. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed.


Section 3. If any section, clause, provision, or portion of this ordinance is adjudged unconstitutional or invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, the remainder of this ordinance shall not be affected thereby.




