It is filed with the county auditor and the designating body before May 15, or by the due date of the real property owner's personal property return that is filed in the township where the property is located. 5. With the approval of the designating body, compliance information for multiple projects may be consolidated on one (1) compliance form (Form CF-1/Real Property).

INSTRUCTIONS: (IC 6-1.1-12.1-5.1 and IC 6-1.1-12.1-5.9)

1. Not later than forty-five (45) days after receipt of this form, the designating body may determine whether or not the property owner has substantially complied with the Statement of Benefits (Form SB-1/Real Property).
2. If the property owner is found **NOT** to be in substantial compliance, the designating body shall send the property owner written notice. The notice must include the reasons for the determination and the date, time and place of a hearing to be conducted by the designating body. The date of this hearing may not be more than thirty (30) days after the date this notice is mailed. A copy of the notice may be sent to the county auditor and the county assessor.
3. Based on the information presented at the hearing, the designating body shall determine whether or not the property owner has made reasonable efforts to substantially comply with the Statement of Benefits (Form SB-1/Real Property) and whether any failure to substantially comply was caused by factors beyond the control of the property owner.
4. If the designating body determines that the property owner has **NOT** made reasonable efforts to comply, then the designating body shall adopt a resolution terminating the property owner's deduction. If the designating body adopts such a resolution, the deduction does not apply to the next installment of property taxes owed by the property owner or to any subsequent installment of property taxes. The designating body shall immediately mail a certified copy of the resolution to: (1) the property owner; (2) the county auditor; and (3) the county assessor.

INSTRUCTIONS

- The application must be submitted to the body designating the Economic Revitalization Area prior to the public hearing of the designating body requires information from the applicant in making its decision about whether to designate or re-designate Economic Revitalization Area. Designating body statements must be submitted to the designating body BEFORE the redevelopment or rehabilitation of real property for which the person wishes to claim a deduction. Projects planned or completed to date July 1, 1987, and areas designated after July 1, 1987, require a STATEMENT OF BENEFITS. (IC 6-1.1-12.1)
- Approval of the designating body (City Council, Town Board, County Council, etc.) must be obtained prior to initiation of the redevelopment or rehabilitation. BEFORE a deduction may be approved.
- In obtaining a deduction Form 522-EP-3, Application for Deduction, from assessed valuation of structures in Economic Revitalization Areas, must be filed with the County Auditor by the date of (1) filing (10) or (2) filing (30) days after the date of addition to assessed valuation or new assessment is mailed to the property owner at the address shown on the records of the township assessor.
- Property owners whose Statement of Benefits was approved after June 30, 1991, must submit Form CF-17RE annually to show compliance with the Statement of Benefits. (IC 6-1.1-12.1-5.1(b))
- The schedules established under IC 6-1.1-12.1-4(d) effective July 1, 2000, apply to any statement of benefits filed on or after July 1, 2000. The schedules effective prior to July 1, 2000, shall continue to apply to those statements of benefits filed before July 1, 2000.


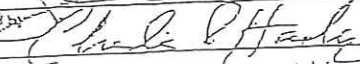

FOR USE BY THE DESIGNATING BODY

We have reviewed our prior actions relating to the designation of this Economic Revitalization Area and find that the applicant meets the general standards adopted in the resolution previously approved by this body. Said resolution passed under IC 6-1.1-12.1-2.5, provides for the following limitations as authorized under IC 6-1.1-12.1-2.

- A. The designated area has been limited to a period of time not to exceed 10 calendar years* (see below). The date this designation expires is 2016.
- B. The type of deduction that is allowed in the designated area is limited to:
- 1. Redevelopment or rehabilitation of real estate improvements; Yes No
 - 2. Residentially distressed areas Yes No.
- C. The amount of deduction applicable for redevelopment or rehabilitation is limited to \$ _____ cost with an assessed value of \$ 545,219.98.
- D. Other limitations or conditions (specify) _____
- E. The deduction for redevelopment or rehabilitation is allowed for 10 years* (see below).

Also we have reviewed the information contained in the statement of benefits and find that the estimates and expectations are reasonable and have determined that the totality of benefits is sufficient to justify the deduction described above. (IC 6-1.1-12.3(b)).

* If the designating body limits the time period during which an area is an economic revitalization area, it does not limit the length of time a taxpayer is entitled to receive a deduction for a number of years designated under IC 6-1.1-12.1-4.

For residentially distressed areas, the deduction period may not exceed five (5) years. If the Economic Revitalization Area was designated prior to July 1, 2000, the deduction period is limited to three (3), six (6), or ten (10) years. For EPAs after June 30, 2000, the deduction period may not exceed ten (10) years. An area designated as an urban development area pursuant to an application filed after December 31, 1976, and prior to January 1, 1995, are entitled to a ten (10) year deduction.
